

Biography of Rev. Jacqueline Adams Cook

Rev. Jacqueline Adams Cook is the only child born to the late Mr. & Mrs. John Julian and Lila Mae Adams. She is a graduate of American University, Washington, D.C. and is now pursuing a Masters of Divinity Degree at the National Bible College in Fort Washington, Maryland. God has blessed Rev. Cook with her husband, Herman Sr.; two sons, Herman Jr. and Derrick; and one grandchild, Chase Elijah. She is a Senior Analyst at the U.S. General Accounting Office and has worked there over 30 years.

Rev. Cook has served and worked in the church since she was a little girl. Her grandmother would often tell her stories how even at the ages of 3 and 4 years old; she would get happy and shout, just like her grandmother. As a child she gave her life to the Lord and served at Mt. Pleasant Baptist Church, Washington, D.C. She attended Sunday School and Church regularly, sang in the Children's Choir, served on the Jr. Usher Board and was President of the Board for many years. She also served as the spokes person for the Youth.

She believes that the elders working with the Youth when she was a child, greatly contributed to her knowledge and desire to work with children. In the service of the Lord for well over 20 years, Rev. Cook's Christian service has included singing with the Sincere Gospel Singers and with the Voices of Mt.
