Willie Roy Ferguson, Jr. was born July 8 1984 in Washington D.C. He currently resides in Silver Spring Maryland, with his parents, Willie Roy Ferguson Sr. and Mary Malone Ferguson. Willie has a younger sister, Jasmine and an older brother Carlos.

In June 2003, Willie graduated from Paint Branch High School, Burtonsville, Maryland. After graduation Willie attended the Washington Saturday College in Washington D.C. for two years completing studies in Old and New Testament. He continued to further his education at the Howard University School of Divinity, where he received two diploma in December 2003, one in Bible Studies and one in Ministry.

Willie continued to pursue his education at the Breakthrough Bible College in Temple Hills, Maryland receiving a bachelors degree in Biblical Studies in June 2008. He is currently pursuing his Master degree in Biblical Studies and expects to graduate as it is ordered by God.

On December 22, 1998 Willie was hit by a car while walking to school. He sustained a traumatic brain injury and was in a coma for two and a half months as a result of the injury. He was in shock trauma unit in Baltimore for almost a month and spent another three months in the National Rehabilitation Hospital in Washington D.C. Before the accident Willie enjoyed playing basketball and football at Paint Branch High School in Burtonsville, Maryland. Before his accident Willie played softball at Benjamin Bannecker Middle School in Burtonsville Maryland. He also played Basketball in Montgomery County Recreation Center for five years before his accident.

Even though Willie's dream was to be a star athlete, God's plan for him was different. One of Willie's favorite scriptures is John 14:1 reads "Let not your heart be troubled, you believe in God, believe also in me." Willie has a very strong family support in his mother, grandmother, sister, father, Aunt Gwen, Aunt Shirley, Uncle Garland, and his church family. Willie feels his greatest source of faith comes from his spiritual father Pastor John W. Davis. Willie also thanks God for his aunt, Evangelist Gwen Allen, for playing a major roll in his spiritual development. Willie was licensed to preach on March 8, 2009.
